SUMMARY OF MEETING: After introductions, Thermo Fisher Scientific representatives briefed Commissioner Moore and his staff on their company's XRF analyzers, how the instruments are being used for testing materials for presence of lead, and the development of standard reference materials. They indicated that more than 20,000 analyzers have been sold worldwide at a cost ranging from \$25,000 to \$45,000. They then discussed the prospects of using

XRF analyzers for drywall elemental analysis and updated the Commissioner on their discussions with the CPSC's lab personnel on dry wall screening and the utilization of XRF instrumentation.

Commissioner Moore thanked them for their presentation and the meeting ended.
