SUMMARY OF MEETING:

Representatives and members of the Chemical Specialties Manufacturers Association (CSMA) met with CPSC staff to discuss the proposed revisions to the child-resistant packaging test protocols. A copy of the agenda is attached. The effective date and the impact on the household chemical products was discussed. The member companies discussed problems associated with child-resistant packaging for the aerosol and hydrocarbon-based products. The companies stated that more than one year will be necessary in order to develop and test "senior friendly" child-resistant packaging for these products. The companies complained that the protocol has changed and cannot be used until it is finalized. The CPSC staff stressed that realistic details of time and cost should be included in the written comments submitted by the CSMA and members.
